Individual treatment plan shall include at a minimum the recommended:

a. Initial level for placement in treatment based on the DVRNA (Reference Standard 4.06 for Levels of Treatment);25

Who will determine the appropriate treatment plan for the abuser?

b. Treatment goals specific and measurable objectives to target criminogenic needs including, domestic violence and issues related to power and control;26

Examples of goals:

- 1. Client will complete all competencies identified in the personal change plan before discharge from the program as measured by:
- 2. Client will complete 2-3 MTT reviews with the primary AIP provider before discharge from the program as measured by:
- *3. Client will* complete all individual counseling as recommended by the MTT *before discharge from the program as measured by:*
- 4. Client will complete a closing interview with the referring body before discharge from the program as measured by:
- 5. Client will

c. Methods for enhancing positive and pro-social factors;

How will on-going support be provided after the client completes the program?

d. Second contact interventions or treatment options that are the most clinically relevant to addressing the most significant criminogenic need for Level B and C offenders (not applicable for Level A offenders);

How will client and referring body be involved in updating and modifying personal change plan as new information becomes available or client insight and integration happens?

e. Supervision or monitoring recommendations needed to enhance the safety of the victim and offender containment;27

Who will provide on-going supervision/monitoring of victim safety and methods used to hold abuser accountable?

f. Considerations for Specific Abuser Population (as defined in Standard 9.0), Approved Providers shall utilize all applicable assessment criteria (Reference Appendix B).

Who will be responsible to determine if the abuser meets the requirements of a Specific Abuser population?
